Today, Utah's century-old Heber Valley Railroad operates as a non-profit tourist passenger railroad that runs through a beautiful, lush valley, along the shore of a year-round recreational lake and through a steep, forested canyon

The area known for its natural diversity and beauty is also home to extreme weather conditions. With a fleet of vintage, restored passenger cars and seven locomotives—including two steam driven ones dating back more than a 100 years—HVRR's concern was the toll that constant exposure to the environment and weather was taking on the life of its equipment.
